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Climate-related development finance statistics (Rio markers)

- Rio marker data often informs members' financial reporting to the UNFCCC
 - Most members apply adjustments to the data
- Ongoing work to enhance transparency between climate finance reported to the DAC and the UNFCCC
 - Proposal to adjust reporting to CRS to capture whether and which share of an activity reported to CRS is also reported to UNFCCC
 - Next steps: written comments by 15 March and formal proposal at next working party on statistics (June)

TOSSD roadmap

- Embed TOSSD within the international system
- Establish informal “TOSSD working group”
- TOSSD pilots in Philippines, Latin America
- TOSSD proposal tabled at UNSC Meeting in March 2018
- TOSSD included in global SDG indicator framework



Publicly-mobilised private finance: what can already be (at least partly) measured

- Private co-finance committed alongside multilateral and bilateral public climate finance
- Mobilised private finance attributable to specific development finance instruments and actors
- Mobilised private finance attributable to developed countries' public climate finance





Publicly-mobilised private finance: work ahead on data and methodologies

Work area	On-going and future work
Improve and expand methods for private finance mobilised by public finance instruments/mechanisms	<ul style="list-style-type: none">→ Joint-work with OECD DAC in close collaboration with DFIs→ Further explore the role of export credits
Research data and methods to estimate the catalytic effect of capacity building and policy-related interventions	<ul style="list-style-type: none">→ Develop methods to estimate the effect of public policies that can be monetised→ Identify suitable financial or non-financial indicators for other public interventions
Pursue work to identify and estimate the mobilisation effect of developing country public interventions	<ul style="list-style-type: none">→ South Africa case study jointly with local think tank, government, DFIs→ Establish further partnerships with finance and research institutions



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
